## Kath-Khuni depicts beauty, integrity of Himalayan architecture: Prof Thakkar

TO MARK World Heritage Week, Indira Gandhi Rashtriya Manav Sangrahalaya (IGRMS) organised a special lecture on the topic 'Kath-Khuni Architecture of the Himalayas: Sustainability and Change' on Tuesday.

Mansi Shah said that Kath-Khuni, the traditional building construction system in Himachal Pradesh, is the result of extensive field work research, analysis and documentation carried out in Himachal Pradesh from 2005 to 2011.
